NOTICE: This is not my final column for the SEED. That will be in the August issue, which we plan to have published July 28. HOWEVER, I do have a few things to share with you on the upcoming transition.

Will "The Table" Still Meet?

"The Table" will not meet July 4 or 11 (due to VBS), but will continue July 18 and 25. The group that regularly attends "The Table" at 6:30 p.m. every Thursday plans to continue meeting. Since there won't be Holy Communion, the format may change. They may continue to follow the first part of the service ... gather, have an opening prayer, share God Moments, read and discuss Scriptures for the coming Sunday, pray for joys and concerns, and just end with the Lord's Prayer. OR, they may decide to switch to a published Bible Study.



About a dozen women attend The Table regularly – an average of six to eight weekly. This gathering was originally a Women's Bible Study that Ashley Maas got started not long after I came in 2011. It was changed to "The Table" on April 19, 2018, and has been open to anyone – women or men. But only one man has come one time that I can remember. When we have an interim pastor, he or she and the group can decide if they want to start The Table again.



What about Coffee & Devotions?

The group that meets every Tuesday morning at 10 a.m. has been getting smaller, as we have lost some who can no longer get out and about and, of course, we lost Daune McCulloch to heaven. So, the group

decided that **July 23 would be our last regular meeting time** in the Fellowship Hall. HOWEVER, they plan to continue to meet at Good Sam at 10 a.m. the second Tuesday of each month.

With all the retired people in our congregation, it seems there should be enough to have a weekly Bible Study or devotional time during the day. **If someone else would like to get one started – maybe at a different time and day – go for it!** Or, maybe when the interim pastor gets here, he or she would want to start up Coffee & Devotions again or something else.

Prayer Ministry Coordinator Sought

Council, Mutual Ministry Team, Worship Team all agree that our Prayer Warrior program should continue as is, preferably with a volunteer coordinator. If you are not a Prayer Warrior you see just the tip of the iceberg of this program with the list of names in the Sunday announcements. Prayer Warriors receive weekly updates via email or snail mail explaining the prayer need and who requested it.



When I got here, Barb and Bruce Holderbaum were taking care of this program. When they could no longer do it, I picked it up. I probably spend 2 to 4 hours a week on the updates and keeping track of who is on the list ... often calling or texting people if I haven't heard anything in a while. This is a sacred calling and we would welcome someone who is detail-oriented, computer savvy, compassionate and discerning to keep this up. If we don't have a volunteer, our temporary parish administrator (Bonnie Scranton) is willing to do this, but a volunteer would help assure continuity when the next pastor comes. By the way, when a name is taken off the prayer list, I move it to another page in an excel spreadsheet. There are now 579 names of people we have prayed for (some of which may well be repeats). If you are interested in this ministry, let me know!

Christ Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes – June 11, 2019

Members Absent: Andrew Maas, Brandon Ross, Bill Wolters
President Tabb opened the meeting with prayer. Kathy Buckman led devotions. Meeting called to order at 6:37 p.m.

Approval of Minutes: Motion that the minutes on the May 14 council meeting be approved as corrected carried.

President's Report: Dick Tabb reported on the following:

- 1) The Parish Administrator Committee will meet June 12 to establish a job description, set guidelines, etc.
- 2) Nine synod churches are seeking interim pastors – down from 12.
- 3) Strategic Planning meeting will be Saturday, June 15.
- 4) Cottage Meeting notes were provided and Dick asked that council members review them and come prepared Saturday to discuss and provide suggestions for anything that needs to be included in the Strategic Plan.

Pastor's Report:

- 1) Pastor's printed report for May was distributed/reviewed.
- 2) Pastor plans to take Sunday June 30, and five days in the following two weeks as her last vacation days. Pastor Jim Trutwin will conduct services on June 30 and Pastor Gayle will be available for any emergency calls.
- 3) Pastor reported on the Synod Assembly. She said the Assembly went well, general conversation among attendants seemed to center on where God is calling the church and how is God leading us to meet today's needs in the world. Jim Hobbins spoke about how Daune McCulloch touched his life and how impressed he was with the luncheon following Daune's memorial service. This last observation generated a spontaneous outpouring of compliments and thanks for work Char Tooke does with Fellowship Ministry.

Treasurer's/ Financial Secretary's Report:

- Printed reports for May were distributed by Bonnie Scranton for council to review and discuss. Motion to accept reports and place on file for audit carried.
- Bonnie stated that the Ministry Team budgets were in good order and urged council members to continue to monitor team budgets and spending.
- Bonnie will be on vacation June 19 through July 1. She assured us that Robin Lentz will be available to write checks for any unexpected expenses.

Ministry Team and Committee Reports:

- **Communications:** Pastor Gayle reported that she has prepared a list of messages to be used for the sign. Bonnie Scranton reported that the outdoor sign has been repaired and bulbs replaced. The sign did not need a new ballast and cost of repairs was \$150.
- **Fellowship:** No report
- **Learning:** Sara Klusmeyer reported that Jane and Sarah Meginnes and Kensey McGartland have been working on lesson preparations of the new Spark Curriculum, which uses the Children's Bible used at Christ Lutheran. Lessons have been prepared through July and Sunday School is going well. There will be a Blessing Buddy event on July

23. June 22 has been selected as a playground workday. Sara will have mulch delivered and will seek volunteers to assist with moving mulch.

- **Mutual Ministry:** No report
- **Property:** Jim Hobbins wanted to know how the recycling was going. Katie Rupp explained that all was working well and the system used to remove church recyclables each week. Jim reported that the flooring project was scheduled to be completed June 12; that there was no date set yet for indoor and outdoor work days. The resurfacing of the east parking lot is on hold due to additional work that needs to be done by the city.
- **Service:** Katie Rupp reported that \$406.30 was collected for Lutheran Disaster Relief; the "God's Work. Our Hands." joint LMC/CLC committee has met and plans are underway.
- **Stewardship:** No Report
- **Worship:** Bonnie Scranton reported on Pulpit Supply for August: Pastor Jim Trutwin August 4 and 18, Pastor Jeff Rasche August 11, and Pastor Paul Schwartzkoph August 25. Important dates to remember: July 7 Pastor Kristen Fryer will be here to share with us and July 28 will be Pastor Gayle's last Sunday. Next meeting is June 12 at 1 p.m.
- **Risk Management Committee:** Dick Tabb reported Serve-Pro has completed Emergency Readiness Profile which will be available for members. Andrew Maas will provide Council with a review of the report at July meeting.
- **Memorial Garden Committee:** Bonnie Scranton reported that proofing of orders has been completed. The equivalent of 75 4x8 bricks, 3 landscape stones, and 2 benches have been ordered. Harrison's will do the engraving and Bergman's will complete the installation.
- **Finance and Investment Committee:** No report
- **Endowment Committee:** No report
- **Columbarium Oversight Committee:** No report

Motion that reports be accepted carried.

Old Business:

- a) Dick Tabb reported that he had reviewed the list of church members with keys to the building and that all keys are secure and currently needed by holders.
- b) Invitation from First Baptist Church for a joint picnic has not progressed and Pastor Gayle will contact them.
- c) Playground update revealed that there are some loose and/or missing bolts as well as some rotten wood on top end of posts that support the shade coverings. Mulch will be done Saturday June 22 and Sara will check with Andrew Maas to see if the Scouts could do painting as a project.

New Business:

- a) The Shepherding Circle program is in need of two or three additional shepherd leaders.

Adjournment: Motion to adjourn at 7:55 p.m. carried. Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Bonnie Scranton to Begin as Parish Administrator July 16

As you are aware, the church council has determined the need for a Parish Administrator during the time we are without a full-time pastor – interim or called – to provide support and oversight of the day to day activities of our church. Bonnie



Scranton has accepted that position, and will start her duties on Tuesday, July 16 so as to assist Pastor Gayle and assure a smooth transition. Bonnie may serve in this capacity anywhere from six weeks to six months. Hopefully it will only be a month or two until the Synod has provided an interim pastor to serve us.

A complete Parish Administrator job description is available in the church office. These duties include the following, among others:

- Preparing weekly worship materials
- Publishing The SEED, weekly News & Announcements, and other mass communications, to possibly include Prayer Warrior updates
- Facilitating ordained pastor assistance to families in the event of illness, death, or other crises
- Supporting the needs of ministry teams
- Assisting with scheduling volunteers and planning church events where needed
- Responding to phone calls and emails, answering inquiries, in general keeping up with communications inside and outside the church in coordination with the church secretary
- Coordinating the church calendar
- Supervising the church secretary

Bonnie will keep regular office hours of 1-4 p.m. Tuesday-Friday (12 hours per week) but may work up to 20 hours per week if needed to meet expectations. You can call her with any questions or needs and if she can't help, she'll find the answer.

Bonnie wants it to be clearly understood that the duties she already does as a volunteer Treasurer and committee member, she will continue to do as a volunteer. She typically is here on Saturdays and Mondays taking care of those responsibilities.

As we begin this new adventure let us all reflect on the need to stay focused in our commitment to our mission: "Christ Cares: Share the Faith."

Have we become complacent, not really thinking we are helping? I have heard people say, "I don't think we have anyone that needy in Quincy. People just know how to "game" the system. Why don't they just get a job? Businesses are begging for help. They are too lazy or have addictions, that's why they need food." Any or all of that may be true in some cases, but is it our place to judge?

We give food because we care about our neighbors. By doing so, we serve our Lord and Savior. Jesus said, "As you do it to the least of these, my brethren, you do it unto me." May we keep that in mind as we select items for the food basket.

1. Protein items (includes baked beans, chili beans)
2. Canned meats (chicken, tuna)
3. Canned meals or boxed meals (chili, stew, mac and cheese, meals with all the ingredients in them)
4. Macaroni & cheese, spaghetti & spaghetti sauce
5. Soups, especially chicken noodle & vegetable
6. Canned fruit and vegetables
7. Nuts (especially English walnuts, dry roasted almonds, peanuts)
8. Bisquick (or similar mixes that make a variety of dishes with little or no additional ingredients)
9. Fresh apples, potatoes
10. Powdered milk & canned evaporated milk
11. Dry cereals
12. Paper products (toilet tissue, facial tissue, diapers)
13. Laundry detergent, cleaning products
14. Deodorant, shampoo, toilet soap
15. Hotel size soaps, shampoos, lotions, etc.
16. Baby care products and baby food

What an exciting Sunday we'll have Sept. 8 when we serve doing "God's Work. Our Hands." We will have 4 locations offering service opportunities:

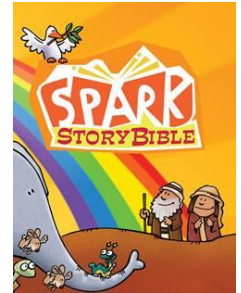

- 3) **Quanada:** Waiting to hear back which project they will have for us that day.
- 4) **Illinois Veteran's Home gardens:** Help clean up the gardens and prepare them for winter. If you plan to help here, bring your own gloves and tools labeled with your name.

Further information such as start and end times will be decided at our next meeting on July 16.

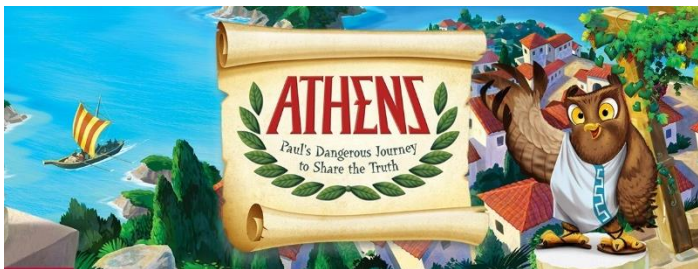
July 8: Create-A-Card Class

Marking a Season of Transition

Beginning with Sunday, June 23, we begin “the time between seasons” which is sometimes referred to as the ordinary season, or the green season. This time after Pentecost lasts until the Saturday before the first Sunday of Advent, which is December 1. During this quieter time between church seasons, your worship team will continue to meet monthly to plan services, select hymns, etc.

For the immediate future we will also be responsible for ensuring that there is a presiding minister for each

Sunday between Pastor Gayle’s retirement and an interim pastor’s arrival. Our goal during this “time between pastors” is to schedule guest/supply pastors who are either ordained or approved by the Bishop to preside over the sacrament of Holy Communion.

Since the ELCA is in an ecumenical agreement known as “full communion” with the United Methodist Church and other denominations,* we do have the option for a regular communion service with a Methodist pastor presiding. This will be the case on August 11, when Pastor Jeff Rasche will be leading us in worship. The full schedule of visiting pastors for August is: August 4 & 18 - Pastor Jim Trutwin, August 11 - Pastor Jeff Rasche, August 25 - Pastor Paul Schwartzkopf.

On behalf of the entire Worship Ministry Team I want to take this opportunity to thank Pastor Gayle for her spiritual leadership at Christ Lutheran for the past eight years. We have been more than blessed to have her here and wish her nothing but the best as she begins a new chapter in her life at the end of this month. Godspeed, Pr. Gayle!
