## Christ Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes – August 20, 2019

At 6:25 p.m. Dick Tabb opened the meeting with prayer; Sara Klusmeyer led devotions. Dick called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Additions to the Agenda: Andrew Maas requested that Scouts be added under New Business.

**Approval of Minutes:** Motion for the minutes to be approved as amended carried. Motion that the minutes of the August 13 council meeting minutes be approved carried.

**President's Report:** Dick reviewed the update that he had given the congregation on August 18.

**Parish Administrator's Report:** Bonnie Scranton presented a printed report for review by the council. Motion that the report be approved, carried.

**Treasurer's/Financial Secretary's Report:** Printed reports for July were distributed by Bonnie Scranton for council to review and discussion. Motion to accept reports and to place the financial report on file pending audit carried.

Bonnie reported that she would arrange two meetings in Sept. One with the Executive Committee to discuss/establish salaries and the second with the Finance & Investment Committee and Property Team to discuss capital improvements for 2020.

#### **Ministry Team and Committee Reports:**

- **Communications:** No report
- **Fellowship:** No report
- Learning: Sara Klusmeyer reported that the first KNO of the school year would be Sept. 27, and that the CLC-LMC Youth Group would have a gathering at CLC on Sept. 29. The youth group is for youth in grades 6 thru 12. The Learning Team is looking for members who would be interested in organizing activities for adult learning. The Learning Team will be asking for cash donations with which to provide the KNO meal rather than food donations. Any funds received over the cost of the monthly meal will be saved specifically for future KNO meals. Sign-up for children to attend KNO can be completed on-line.
- Mutual Ministry: No report
- Property: Andrew Maas reported that the removal of plant material along the south wall of the church building will be on Sept. 7. Some of the scouts and their parents will be volunteering to help pick up and load branches. Andrew Maas, Jim Dunn, Stu Bell, and Richard and Sara Klusmeyer will do the cutting with chainsaws. Bonnie Scranton reported that Keith Klusmeyer, a professional landscaper with Bergman Nurseries, said that a retaining wall was not needed in that area. She also said that additional volunteers are needed to load brush. Jim Hobbins reported that after his meeting with Keith, he was concerned about how the south wall could be used to tell people "We are Christ Lutheran Church and we are here for you." As much work as possible would be completed this year and the rest in 2020.
- Service: Connie Hornsey reported on the following: Second Sunday collection in July to support the Back to School Fair totaled \$625.04; in Aug. to support LWR the total was \$193; in Sept. the Second Sunday collection will be on Sept. 15, the third Sunday. GWOH plans are finalized for Sept. 8. CLC is hosting indoor projects, lunch, and childcare. The CROP Walk is

scheduled for Oct. 6, at the Illinois Veteran's Home. Registration begins at 1 p.m. CLC is the hosting church and we will need to provide volunteers. "Adverse Childhood Experiences" will be presented by Shawna Bunnell, of Chaddock, at our fall public education event on Oct. 17. Next meeting will be Sept. 26, at 5:30 p.m.

- **Stewardship:** Matt Futhey reported that the Stewardship team, Matt, Teresa Clauss, Katie Rupp, Bill Wolters, and Jerry Spurgeon will meet Sunday, August 25 to discuss campaign.
- Worship: Kathy Buckman reported that the team reviewed Goal #1 of the Strategic Plan. Team members approved the 2019 update. Hymns were selected for Aug. Supply pastors have been chosen for Aug. and Sept. The next meeting is Aug. 14, 2019.
- **Risk Management:** Andrew Maas said a plaque confirming room capacity of Fellowship Hall needed to be ordered.
- **Memorial Garden:** Bonnie Scranton reported that the work was 90% completed. Solar lighting, stones, and fences need to be added. She reminded us it's never too late to add a memorial.
- Finance and Investment: No report
- Endowment: No report
- Columbarium Oversight: Bonnie Scranton reported that visitors from St. John's Anglican Church downtown came to view our chapel/columbarium and memorial garden. St. John's is considering the addition of a columbarium.

Motion that Ministry & Committee Reports be accepted carried.

#### **Old Business:**

a. Copies of 2019 updated Strategic Plan were presented/reviewed. Motion that 2019 Strategic Plan be approved, carried.
b. The council revisited the request by the Service Team for an official letter from CLC supporting the rental inspection program for Quincy. The council agreed and Connie Hornsey volunteered to write the letter for council approval.

#### **New Business:**

- a) Dick Tabb suggested that a sub-committee be formed to begin work on the MSP. Dick also reported the congregation letter has been written and includes copies of the 2 surveys, 1 per member and a return envelope. He asked council members to complete their surveys & encourage others to do the same.
- b) Pastor Gayle belonged to the Quincy Area Ministerial Association. It was decided that this was an important community connection to keep. Dick Tabb will contact the group and let them know that while we are without a pastor, the congregation of CLC will continue to support QAMA.
- c) Pastor Gayle gave Dick a list of visitors and potential new members she had been communicating with prior to retirement. Dick will follow up with this list and proposed that Shepard Leaders may be able to take over hospital and shut-in visits.
- d) Andrew Maas requested that the church put up signage inside an outside to support the Scouting program.
- e) A member of the congregation suggested that CLC consider the idea of purchasing a parsonage. In light of the information provided by Pr. Maureen Stein on August 13, and after discussion, the council came to a unanimous decision not to recommend purchasing a parsonage.

**Adjournment:** Motion to adjourn at 8:05 p.m. carried. Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

# **September Food Donations Going to Luther Memorial**

We are receiving food gifts for the Luther Memorial food pantry during September. Our gifts in August went to St. John's pantry. This is a project we have been doing for several years and it seems like it is the same old

activity every month. Please put yourself in the position of needing to use a food pantry.

How would you cope with fixing dinner with no food in the house? Most of us go to the pantry or freezer and need to make a decision of what sounds good. What if you had no freezer and you had nothing or just one package of something in the pantry?

Many of us compare prices and quality as we shop. When you find a "special buy", could you purchase one more for the grocery cart? You did a great job of filling the cart last month! Can we top it in September? Examples of food items to donate include:

Protein items (includes baked beans, chili beans)
Canned meats (chicken, tuna)
Canned meals or boxed meals
Macaroni & cheese, spaghetti & spaghetti sauce
Soups, especially chicken noodle & vegetable
Canned fruit and vegetables
Nuts (dry roasted almonds, peanuts, etc.)
Bisquick (or similar mixes that make a variety of dishes
with little or no additional ingredients)
Fresh apples, potatoes
Boxes of powdered milk & canned evaporated milk
Dry cereals
Paper products (toilet tissue, facial tissue, diapers)
Laundry detergent, cleaning products
Deodorant, shampoo, toilet soap
Hotel size soaps, shampoos, lotions, etc.
Baby care products and baby food

The guidelines also indicate what items cannot be recycled and specifies that items may only be taken to the center on the two Saturdays indicated. #### **Entering into Retirement**

At the last Endowment Committee meeting we discussed topics that

might be helpful for members of our congregation. Ron Larner mentioned how important it was to meet with a financial advisor when it comes time to enter into retirement. His wise words are the basis for this article. The following is taken from Kiplinger's "7 Important Steps to Take in the Year Before You Retire."

Per Kiplinger's, "You wouldn't dream of running a marathon without undergoing months of training. Or heading into the wilderness without making sure you have adequate provisions. Or betting your life savings on a business venture you haven't thoroughly researched. But when it comes to entering retirement – when a failure to plan can have devastating consequences – a surprising number of people are unprepared. More than half of workers older than 55 haven't developed a plan for paying themselves in retirement, and almost two-thirds haven't identified which investments they'll tap first. Many people wait until they've set their retirement date to put together any kind of plan at all.

Planning late is better than never planning, but your chances of a secure retirement will improve if you start making decisions and checking items off your to-do list at least a year out."

These are the seven steps recommended by Kiplinger's. Be sure to check with your financial advisor to see what he or she recommends before you walk out the door of your job for the last time!

- 1. Sign up for Medicare
- 2. Make a Retirement Budget
- 3. Maximize Social Security
- 4. Review Your Portfolio
- 5. Set Your Withdrawal Plan
- 6. Weigh Pension Choices
- 7. Consider an Annuity
