

## This Time of Epiphany

I've been pondering for a number of days now exactly what I wanted to focus this article on as we enter a new year celebrating the time of Epiphany. Should I take this space to write about all we accomplished in 2019 (it was a lot!), or should I focus on

where we think we're headed for 2020, or should I focus on what the Epiphany means for us, as Christians? I suddenly had my own epiphany today when I realized that the Epiphany of our Lord we celebrate this Sunday has a great deal of significance to us as a congregation as we enter into the new year.

To be honest, I have not always paid enough attention to the Epiphany of our Lord and what it really means. In doing some reading recently I now have a much clearer understanding of how the arrival of the wise men, sent by God to see the Christ child, was the beginning of the Epiphany or "revelation" to the world of Jesus as God's own son, sent to save us from sin as God had promised throughout the ages.

These Magi left their homes seeking truth. Theirs was a simple faith, established and solidified by God's Word. And through this simple faith God led them to

see His word fulfilled through Christ's birth and instructed them to proclaim what they had witnessed, to proclaim this revelation, to witness to this Epiphany.

The wise men trusted God, and because they did God's grace was revealed to man. So exactly what relevance does this Epiphany have for us as a congregation entering into this new year with no pastor? A prayer that I came across recently in my Council notebook helped to provide me with some insight in answering that question. "A Prayer of Thomas Norton" reads, "My Lord, God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end. Nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think that I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that the desire to please you does in fact please you. And I hope that I have that desire in all that I am doing. And I know that if I do this you will lead me by the right road though I may know nothing about it. Therefore, will I trust you always, though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death. I will not fear, for you are ever with me, and will never leave me to face my perils alone." If we substitute "we" for "I" in Norton's prayer we can take comfort in being reminded that our future as a congregation is in good hands, as it is in God's hands. In God's time we will have our own epiphany as He makes our next pastor known to us. In the interim, we wait with faith in God's grace.

## Christ Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes – Dec. 10, 2019

**Members Present:** Dick Tabb, Matt Futhey, Katie Rupp, Bonnie Scranton, Kathy Buckman, Connie Hornsey, Tom Jett, Sara Klusmeyer. **Members Absent:** Jim Hobbins, Andrew Maas, Brandon Ross, and Bill Wolters.

At 6:29 pm President Dick Tabb opened the meeting with prayer and led devotions; Matt Futhey will provide devotions in January. Dick called the meeting to order at 6:33 pm. Additions to the Agenda: Bonnie Scranton requested "Use of the parking lot" be added to New Business.

**Approval of Minutes:** After review of the minutes for the November 12<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting and the November 19<sup>th</sup> Special Council Meeting, Motion the minutes of both meetings be approved carried.

**President's Report:** In his report Dick Tabb mentioned the following:

- a. Pastor Sandlin, assistant to the Bishop, will meet with the Call Committee December 11 at 5:30 pm. Dick will report to the council. Pastor Sandlin did indicate to Dick that it was unlikely any pastors would be looking for a call during the holiday season.
- b. Brandon Ross requested that he be allowed to resign from his council position due to his work schedule. The council accepted Brandon's resignation with regret.
- c. Brandon's resignation from the council leaves a two-year term to be filled. The Nominating Committee reported to Dick that Judy Bach agreed to complete the two-year term.
- d. Dick reviewed the 2020 Budget and Annual Report timeline with the council. Tuesday, Jan. 7 the ministry team annual reports are due to the Parish Administrator. Tuesday, Jan. 14 the Council must approve 2020 budget proposal for annual meeting. Sunday, Jan. 19 the 2019 Annual Report will be available to the congregation. Sunday, Jan. 26 the proposed date for the annual congregational meeting. Motion that January 26, 2020, be set as the date for the annual congregational meeting carried.
- e. The council would like to commend the kids and youth for the service on Dec. 8. Everyone did an outstanding job.

**Parish Administrator's Report:** Bonnie Scranton presented a written report of activities for review and discussion. Motion that the report be approved carried.

**Treasurer's /Financial Secretary's Reports:** Printed reports for November were distributed by Bonnie Scranton for council review and discussion. Motion to accept reports and to place the financial report on file pending audit carried.

### Ministry Team and Committee Reports:

- **Communications:** Matt Futhey reported that Bree Wingerter is keeping the Facebook calendar updated and posting Advent devotionals daily. Stuart Peters renewed our website security subscription and asked that postings to the website or Facebook page be submitted several weeks in advance to allow time for updates to be made. Helen Pagel approached Crystal Bliven regarding promotion of Christmas events that members could give to potential visitors. Flyers were created and are available in the narthex. The next meeting will be February 4, 2020 at 5:15 pm. T
- **Fellowship:** Bonnie Scranton reported that the Fellowship team prepared and served luncheons for the funeral of Ruby McGartland on December 5 and the Hanging of the Greens

on December 8. The Fellowship team is considering serving a luncheon after the Removing of the Greens on January 5.

- **Learning:** Sara Klusmeyer reported that KNO was a success. Next KNO will be in February.
- **Mutual Ministry:** No report
- **Property:** Bonnie Scranton reported that the east parking lot repairs and south side landscaping, planned for late October and early November, were rescheduled for spring of 2020, due to weather. Two electricians have indicated interest in bidding on the electrical work needed. They are Steve Edgar of Edgar Electrical and Steve Jansen of Jansen Electrical. Parking lot lighting of the west lot will be a consideration of the Grounds Committee once formed. The timers have been adjusted on those outside lights.
- **Service:** Katie Rupp reported that the November Second Basket collection for Chaddock's Santa Express was \$455. Connie Hornsey and Pat Bell completed the shopping for three boys. The December Second Basket collection for the ELCA Leaders Fund was \$382. At the November 21<sup>st</sup> meeting the Second Sunday, Second Basket Calendar for 2020 was decided upon. Community Education events will continue in 2020. The April 16<sup>th</sup> event will be about Caregiving, and will encompass caregivers of all ages and for all types of needs.
- **Stewardship:** Matt Futhey reported that 59 pledges have been made to date and the average pledge amount shows an increase over last year.
- **Worship:** Kathy Buckman reported on the November 13<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Worship team. Supply pastors for December have been scheduled. The next meeting will be December 16<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 pm.
- **Risk Management:** The result of the testing is that there is NO MOLD in the sanctuary. The council recommended that the Property team arrange for carpet cleaning.

Motion moved that Ministry and Committee Reports be accepted carried.

**Old Business:** No Old Business

### New Business:

- a. The proposed 2020 operating budget was distributed, reviewed, and discussed. The final decision will be made at the January council meeting.
- b. Bonnie Scranton recommended that the balance of the mortgage, \$6,904.03, be paid in full. In the past, the council approved an end of the year payment on the principal of \$10,000. Motion that council approve the payment of \$6,904.03 carried. Christ Lutheran Church will be mortgage free after this payment.
- c. The following individuals will be moved from the Inactive Roll to the Historical Roll; Stefanie Bolte and the Goessling family, Amanda, Matt, Caden, Cober, and Kuli.
- d. After discussion of a vehicle being repeatedly parked in the west parking lot, the council decided Bonnie would place a note on such vehicles that would notify the owner of the private nature of the lot and would include the church contact information.

**Adjournment:** Motion to adjourn at 8:17 pm. carried. Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

During the month of January each year, we gather food for the "Souper Bowl". Instead of food going to a designated pantry, it joins food gifts from churches throughout Quincy to go to several local food pantries. We do have a friendly competition to see who can bring the most food to the collection point. Last year we delivered 257 items of food. That was a slight increase over the previous year. However, I was able to check back to 2009 (first year numbers were available) and discovered we had collected 435 items! Can we do better than 435 this year? The need in our community is not less than in 2009, it is greater. My challenge to each of you is to gather more food this year than 435 items! To God be the glory!

- Protein items (includes baked beans, chili beans)
- Canned meats (chicken, tuna)
- Canned meals or boxed meals
- Macaroni & cheese, spaghetti & spaghetti sauce

- Soups, especially chicken noodle & vegetable
- Canned fruit and vegetables
- Nuts (dry roasted almonds, peanuts, etc.)
- Fresh apples, potatoes
- Boxes of powdered milk & canned evaporated milk
- Dry cereals
- Paper products (toilet tissue, facial tissue, diapers)
- Laundry detergent, cleaning products
- Deodorant, shampoo, toilet soap
- Hotel size soaps, shampoos, lotions, etc.
- Baby care products and baby food

to 4 p.m. at 1620 Windermere Court, Quincy. Depending on class size we could finish earlier. We will be making a Teepee birthday card, a Valentine,

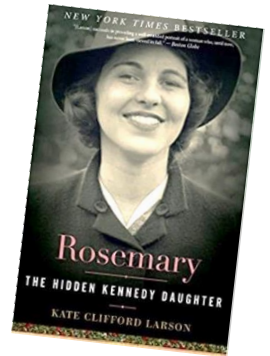

## Operating Budget Highlights through November 30, 2019

The 2019 operating budget balance continues to be in the black when 2019 prepaid contributions are taken into account. I have included the equivalent of eleven months (Jan – Nov) of 2019 prepaids in this month’s attached chart. While monthly giving continues to be down, we are in the black significantly due to salary savings from August through November. Given our financial position at this point, Council voted at their Dec. 10<sup>th</sup> meeting to pay off the remaining principal of the mortgage, which was \$6,904.03.

There may be a small amount of residual interest still due, but

essentially the note we took out in 2002 to pay for the new sanctuary & narthex, and the remodeling of the original structure, has now been paid off. It was paid off early due entirely to the generosity and financial commitment of the members of this congregation over the past 17+ years. We are truly blessed! At the December 10 council meeting we also took a first look at the 2020 operating budget. Due primarily to a drop in the number of individuals making pledges and anticipated increases in salary and benefits for a new pastor the initial draft indicated a deficit for 2020. However, council does have options to consider between now and their January meeting. I am confident that we can make adjustments at that meeting that will allow us to present a balanced 2020 operating budget to the congregation for approval at the annual meeting on January 26<sup>th</sup>. In the interim, thank you as always for your financial commitment to the work we do as a church family. I hope each of you has a great start to the new year!
